Slow Play Test

The Idylwylde has a 4:24 minute pace of play standard, which includes a brief stop at the halfway house. This means the pace is really 4:15.

- 4:15 is plenty of time to complete 18 holes of golf at the Idylwylde under any conditions. If you answer <u>YES</u> to any of the questions below, you may be guilty of slow play:
- 1. Have you ever taken more than 40 seconds to play a shot?
- 2. Do you feel compelled to stop at every body of water that you come across to see if there are any golf balls within easy reach and if there are, pull out your ball retriever and go after them even when everyone in your group has a ball in play on dry ground?
- 3. Have you ever walked over to your ball without a club in hand then realize it's the wrong club and walk back to the cart to get another one?
- 4. Do you take more than 1 practice swing per shot?
- 5. When finished putting, do you sit in your carts next to the green and record the scores and/or settle any doubtful points before heading to the next tee?
- 6. Do you sometimes leave your cart (or pull cart) in front of the green while you putt?
- 7. When you have 250 yards left to the green, do you wait until the green clears even though the longest approach shot you've ever hit in your life is 200 yards (including roll)?
- 8. Do you wait until it is your turn to putt before you plumb bob it or study the line?
- 9. When playing in Better Ball competitions and your partner has holed out for a 5, do you insist on sinking your putt for a 10 so that "you can have a score for the hole"?
- 10. If you and your group like to walk, do you all stand together while someone hits before heading over to your ball?
- 11. When someone in your group is looking for their ball in the tall grass or the woods do you sit (or stand) idly by while they look for it all alone?
- 12. When waiting to play, do you insist on finishing your story or joke even though the group ahead is gone and it's clear to hit?
- 13. Do you insist on marking, cleaning your ball and lining it up when you are attempting your fourth or fifth putt?
- 14. Has your group ever walked into the clubhouse upon completing a round to a rousing round applause from the rest of the players in the clubhouse?

If every player in a group of 4 could shave 30 seconds off the time it takes to play a hole, that would add up to 2 minutes saved per hole times 18 holes, that's 36 minutes per round!

If you typically take 70 seconds to play every shot and you can shave those 30 seconds off every shot on the hole – wow – the results could be mind boggling!

We all want the same thing from playing this wonderful game, enjoyment. We need to be cognizant of our own habits and do everything we can to ensure we all have an enjoyable time on the golf course.

We saw some great improvement to our times last year and will be pushing even harder to see our slowest day being played at 4:24. Take the 14 questions test and challenge yourself to improve your playing times to spite what we watch on a weekly basis on the PGA Tour.


